Police Matters . PCSO Roger Anthony presented his report to Council of the following incidences :-

Cllr Edward Thomas proposed that the report including those amendments be accepted as the Council's submitted observations to Carmarthenshire County Council's Planning Committee for consideration on the proposed Sainsbury's planning application. Cllr Ros Bellamy seconded. All were in favour.

The Mayor expressed her thanks to the subgroup who had prepared the report and to all Councillors who had worked very hard to consider in depth this planning application.

County Councillor Ieuan Jones stated that he wished it recorded that he did not have any declarable interest in the Sainsbury planning application, and he was neither for nor against the application.

CC Jones spent some time in explaining the new Local Development Plan that had completed its consultation period. He stated that the Unitary Development Plan had been superseded since 2006.

He asked complaints regarding litter be sent to Street Scene via himself. He was also aware of difficulties in some streets regarding the new residents parking scheme, and the County Council were monitoring the situation during the trial period.
